



	Skills and Knowledge
Year 3	Children will learn to: - engage in simple conversations by asking and answering questions, making statements about their name, age and activities, and expressing basic opinions and preferences. - seek clarification and help when they do not understand. - speak in short sentences using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures. - develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that they can be understood when speaking familiar words and phrases. - listen to, understand and respond to key words and ideas in French stories, songs, poems and rhymes. - recognise the written form of familiar vocabulary and begin to respond to it. - make links between French phonemes (sounds) and their spellings. - describe people orally using simple vocabulary. - begin writing familiar vocabulary with support.
Year 4	Children will learn to: - listen to and show understanding of short phrases through a physical response. - engage in conversations by asking and answering questions, expressing opinions, and responding to the opinions of others. - seek clarification and help when they do not understand. - develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that they can be understood when reading aloud or speaking familiar words and phrases. - present their ideas and to memorise and recall a short text. - listen to, understand and respond to stories, songs, poems and rhymes in French. - describe people, places, things, activities and actions using a simple language scaffold. - read and understand familiar written phrases. - read a wider range of words, phrases and sentences aloud with developing accuracy. - make links between French phonemes (sounds) and spellings. - write some familiar words and phrases independently, - use a bilingual dictionary to find the meaning of unfamiliar words.



Year 5	Children will learn to: • read and show understanding of the main points in a text. • develop accuracy in pronunciation and intonation when speaking and reading aloud. • manipulate language by changing a single element in a sentence to create new meaning. • broaden their vocabulary and understand new words introduced in familiar written material, including by using a dictionary. • express likes, dislikes and preferences in spoken and written French. • apply their knowledge of language rules when building short sentences. • understand and use negative statements in familiar contexts.
Year 6	Children will learn to: • listen to and understand the main points and simple opinions in spoken stories, songs or passages. • write phrases on a range of topics using a model for support. • perform narratives, sketches or presentations using memorised or adapted language. • use spoken language confidently to initiate and sustain conversations. • understand and apply basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including: feminine and masculine forms, conjugation of high-frequency verbs, and key features and patterns of French; and to understand how these are similar to or different from English.
