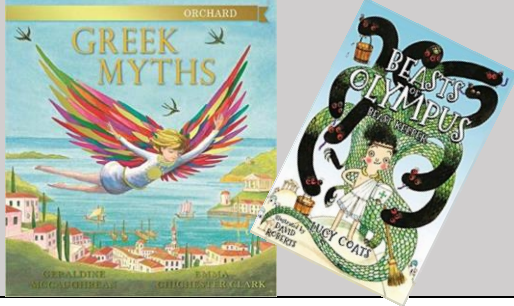


Year 3 Meet the Greeks

4. Physical geography	The branch of geography concerned with the Earth's land masses, oceans and climate, and the distribution of plant and animal species.	
5. Human geography	Man-made features on the Earth such as buildings and transport links.	
6. Parthenon	The temple of Athena built in the Doric style in the fifth century BCE on the Acropolis in Athens.	
7. Column	An upright structure that looks like a post. A column helps support a building.	
8. Myth	A story, person, or thing that has been made up or imagined and is not real.	
9. Labyrinth	A complicated irregular network of passages in which it is difficult to find your way (like a maze).	
10. Amphora	Ancient Greek pots, usually with two handles.
